The Chocolate Box & Brian Grint Centre

The Parish Council are pleased to inform you that Louisa will be soon moving back into the newly renovated Chocolate Box building; she will be in the building and open for business from Monday 14th November. Please pop in and see Louisa and have look at her fantastic new building.

Works to the Brian Grint Centre are due to finish shortly, alongside the Chocolate Box. For those of you who are not aware, the Brian Grint Centre is the doorway on the side of the Chocolate Box building. This area will house Acle Foodbank, and also has potential to be used as a Community Space. The upstairs space will probably be used for Acle Archive in the short-term.

Former Barclays Building

Renovation works to the former Barclays Building have begun and it is expected to be completed by the end of 2022.

There will be 4 units available to rent; 3 will be retail and the 4th, which is the smaller unit, is likely to be either office space or retail. Marketing of the units will be commencing shortly, please keep an eye out for the rental boards going up. Graffiti

Acle Play Areas

Acle Parish Council received a grant for nearly £10,000 from the National Lottery Community Fund to buy four new pieces of Adult Gym Equipment and a Table Tennis Table, which are now installed at Damgate Lane Play Area. The adult gym equipment is for young people over 140cm and adults. We hope it will be a valuable asset to people who enjoy exercising outdoors.

The Parish have also purchased a Basket Swing for Damgate Lane Play Area, this will be installed in the near future.

Report a Problem

Did you know that you can report a Highways problem to Norfolk County Council?

The Highways in the village are owned and managed by Norfolk County Council. If you find any issues such as potholes, problems with public footpaths, flooded roads or pathways, overhanging hedges or bushes, NCC owned streetlights (these are the ones with the yellow labels on) you can report these to Norfolk County Council on https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/roads-andtransport/roads/report-a-problem.

The Parish does report these issues as they come across them but of course if more people are reporting them the quicker there are likely to be dealt with.
